Transportation

Havre is located at the junction of US Highway 2 and 87, 43 miles south of the Canadian border in North Central Montana.

Airport

Havre City/County Airport is served by Cape Air. Flights run daily to and from Billings, with connections in Billings to most major carriers.

Air Freight and Package Express Service

Havre and the Hill County area are serviced by Federal Express, RPS, United Parcel Service, and US Postal Service Express Mail.

Motor Freight

There is motor freight access in and out of Havre. We also have three large freight exchange connections: Billings, 250 miles south of Havre; Great Falls, 110 miles southwest of Havre; and Shelby, 100 miles west of Havre. US Highway 2, which runs through Havre, is the most direct northern connection between Chicago and Seattle.


Rail Service

Utilities and Local Services

Water and Sewer

The water plant has been expanded from a 4½ million capacity to 6 million. Monthly water rates for a one-inch meter are \$35.15, which includes the first 4,000 gallons with a \$2.25 charge per thousand for each additional thousand gallons from October through May and \$2.10 between June and September.

The rate for sewer for buildings with a one-inch water meter is \$15.60 a month which includes the first 3,000 gallons. A yearly average of gallons used is established based on the winter months. \$2.15 is charged for each additional thousand gallons.

Gas and Electricity

NorthWestern Energy's electrical distribution in Havre has a capacity of 47 Mega Watts (MW) with 3 primary substations, and peaks at 24MW. NorthWestern has a natural gas distribution system in Havre with a capacity of 25,000 Million Cubic Feet (MCF) between two gate stations, and a peak of 6,566MCF.

Hill County Electric Cooperative provides electricity to rural members throughout Hill and surrounding counties. HCE sells electrical and telecommunication supplies though their supply warehouse. The cooperative also offers members free energy audits, credit for ground source heat pump installation, recycling of CFL bulbs and electrical safety demonstrations and Master Electrician services.

Havre Public Schools presently has three elementary schools, a middle school, a high school, and an alternative high school located in five different sites. Havre Public Schools, with 138 certified staff members

and 179 support staff, helps approximately 1839 children and young adults achieve their greatest potential. The majority of

teachers have over



10 years of teaching experience and approximately 48% have Master's degrees. The school district promotes continuing education for the staff, who have produced award winning programs in a variety of different areas. Health Care

Northern Montana Health Care (NMHC) provides compassionate, quality health care service to people of North Central Montana. Our Vision is to be the health care provider and employer of choice for our Hi-Line communities.

Our hospital is the center of a comprehensive system of medical services staffed with health care professionals who meet the growing needs of our Hi-Line communities. Our 49-bed acute care hospital provides a 24-hour emergence department, imaging services, (CT scan, nuclear medicine, MRI, mammography, 3-D (4-

D) ultrasound, DEXA, ECH, non-invasive vascular ultrasound lab), radiology, physical and rehabilitation therapy, cardio pulmonary rehabilitation,



obstetrics/gynecology, 24-hour lab services, in-patient and out-patient surgical services, accredited sleep study lab, dialysis unit, anticoagulation clinic and hospice. Our two physician clinics offer family and internal medicine, podiatry, orthopedics, general surgery, obstetrics /gynecology, psychiatry/psychology, visiting nurse services and a pharmacy and individual specialists.

Recreation and Culture

Ten miles south of Havre is Beaver Creek Park, the largest county park in the U.S. The park offers fishing, camping, hiking, picnicking, and cross-country skiing. Bear Paw Ski Bowl is just outside the park. Fishing, boating, water skiing, and swimming are popular at the 12-mile long Fresno Lake west of Havre.

Other recreation opportunities include 2 9-hole golf courses, indoor swimming pool, trap and target shooting, hunting, and an indoor hockey rink. Nationally ranked MSU-Northern teams and high school teams provide sports entertainment.

Montana Actors Theatre sponsor events throughout the year. The local area is rich in historical resources including a buffalo jump, Fort Assinniboine, Havre Beneath the Streets and Railroad Museum and H. Earl Clack Museum along with 3 historic districts: residential, railroad and downtown businesses.
